



<u>Week of Respect</u> – All the classes were given a presentation on harassment, intimidation and bullying.


<u>Let Respect Shine</u> - to kick off Week of Respect School staff and students wore bright colored clothing.

Board Meeting Date: November 22, 2022

<u>After School Tutoring</u>: The Title I After School Tutoring successfully began on October 11th. During the program, students will receive additional support in the areas of English Language Arts and Math on Tuesday and Wednesday after the school day.

<u>Week of Respect</u>: During the week of October 3rd through the 7th, School 4 participated in the statewide "Week of Respect". This week is a part of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights that became effective September 1, 2011. During this week the School Counselor, Mrs. Duca, teaches classroom lessons based on different character education and anti-bullying themes.

- Pre-school students read It's Okay to be Different by Todd Parr. The theme of this lesson was to be kind to each other despite any differences/disabilities. After reading the story together, the children discussed what makes them special. They then drew a self-portrait, emphasizing all of their unique traits.
- Kindergarten read the book <u>Jungle Bullies</u> by Steven Kroll. This book uses jungle animals to teach a lesson about bullying. To get what they want, the larger jungle animals bully the smaller ones until Mama Monkey shows them all the benefits of sharing. Students then colored a picture that shows sharing, and also sequenced the events from the story.
- First grade students read <u>Stand Tall, Molly Lou Melon</u> by Patty Lovell. This book emphasizes the theme that we should be the best person we can be, believe in ourselves, and always be proud of who we are. First grade students were then asked to complete a sentence and drawing to tell what makes them "stand tall" like Molly Lou.
- Second grade students watched a video called "Kindness Boomerang". This short video depicts the ripple-effect
 of kind acts -- the way in which receiving an unexpected moment of generosity from a stranger can cause us to
 become more aware of the needs of those around us and to take action to become a vector of goodness. Each
 kind act from the video was discussed and the effect it had on the mood of the person who was the recipient of
 the kind act and the person performing it. Students then wrote down a way that they can show kindness.
- Third grade students read <u>The Invisible Boy</u> by Trudy Ludwig which is a story about a boy who feels invisible because he is always ignored and left out. It takes a new student that recognizes his special talent for art and makes him feel included. As the story goes on, and the boy feels more noticed, the illustrations show him becoming "visible" again. Students then wrote how they can "light up the world with kindness."

Red Ribbon Week: School #4 students and staff participated in Red Ribbon Week during the week of October 24, 2022 – October 28, 2022. Our school focus was on violence prevention awareness and promoting positive character. Students and staff were encouraged to participate in themed days during the week to reinforce the message (i.e. Bullying is Hair Raising – Crazy Hair Day; Recognize the HERO in yourself! - Help Everyone Respect Others by wearing a superhero shirt).

<u>Vocabulary Parade</u>: On October 19th, students had the opportunity to participate in this academic dress-up event while focusing on vocabulary words to describe their choice of costume. Students, teachers, and guests enjoyed the event.

<u>Sustainable New Jersey</u>: School #4 received bronze status for the fourth year in a row and was recognized at the New Jersey School Boards Association Ceremony.

<u>Home and School Association</u>: Fundraisers to support planned student activities are under way. Our first Book Fair was a success and families enjoyed attending the family night. Our annual Trunk or Treat event occurred on October 27th.

only one in the NFL that faces to the left! The design strategy highlights the letter "E" formed by the feathers in the eagle's head! Students also discovered fun facts about






