0144 BOARD MEMBER ORIENTATION AND TRAINING

The preparation of each Board member for the performance of Board of Education duties is essential to the proper functioning of the Board. The Board encourages each new Board member to acquire information about school district governance, the separate functions of the Board and the Superintendent, the operations of the district, and Board procedures.

The Board directs that each new member receive access to and/or a copy of the Board of Education Bylaw and Policy Manual, the manual of administrative regulations, the current budget statement and audit report, and other materials as deemed appropriate by the Superintendent.

Each new Board member will be invited and is encouraged to meet and discuss the responsibilities and authority of a Board member, Board functions, and Board policies and procedures with the Board President (if available), the Superintendent, and the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary.

Within the first ninety days of a new Board member's first term, the Board member shall complete a training program to be prepared and offered by the New Jersey School Boards Association. The training shall include instruction relative to the Board member's responsibilities pursuant to the School Ethics Act and N.J.S.A. 18A:12-33.

The training program shall include information regarding the school district monitoring system established pursuant to P.L. 2005, c. 235, the New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum, and the five key components of school district effectiveness on which school districts are evaluated under the monitoring system: instruction and program; personnel; fiscal management; operations; and governance.

The Board member shall complete a training program on school district governance in each of the subsequent two years of the Board member's first term.

Within one year after each re-election or re-appointment to the Board of Education, the Board member shall complete an advanced training program to be prepared and offered by the New Jersey School Boards Association. This advanced training program shall include information on relevant changes to New Jersey school law and other information deemed appropriate to enable the Board member to serve more effectively.

The New Jersey School Boards Association shall examine options for providing training programs to Board members through alternative methods such as on-line or other distance learning media or through regional-based training.

Within one year after being newly elected or appointed or being re-elected or re-appointed to the Board of Education, a Board member shall complete a training program on harassment, intimidation, and bullying in schools, including a school district's responsibilities under N.J.S.A. 18A:37-13 et seq. A Board member shall be required to complete the program only once. Training on harassment, intimidation, and bullying in schools shall be provided by the New Jersey School Boards Association, in consultation with recognized experts in school bullying from a cross section of academia, child advocacy organizations, nonprofit organizations, professional associations, and government agencies.

2418 SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973 -STUDENTS (M)

The Board will comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the purpose of which is to eliminate discrimination on the basis of disability in any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

Guarantee of Rights

The Board will provide a free appropriate public education to each student with a disability regardless of the nature or severity of the disability.

The Board will make reasonable accommodations to ensure that no student with a disability, solely on the basis of the disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity sponsored by this Board, including participation in non-academic and extracurricular services and activities.

The administration will undertake to identify and locate all students with disabilities between the ages of three and twenty-two, who are residing within the district, but not receiving a public-school education. The administration will take steps to notify such students and their parents of the district's duty to provide accommodations for students with disabilities as well as procedures to determine eligibility for such accommodations.

Educational Setting

The Board will ensure that a student with a disability participates with nondisabled students in activities and services to the maximum extent appropriate to the needs of the student with a disability.

The school administration will place a student with a disability in the regular educational environment within the district unless the district demonstrates that the education of the student with a disability in the regular environment with the use of supplementary aids and services cannot be achieved satisfactorily.

Evaluation and Placement

The Board will establish standards and procedures for initial evaluations and periodic reevaluations of students who need or are believed to need accommodations, special education, and/or related services because of a disability. Evaluations may include, but are not limited to, a review of work samples, direct observation, interviews, and/or administration of assessment measures.

2421 CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Board of Education believes a program(s) of career and technical education is important to the educational development of its students. The New Jersey system of career and technical education has as its purpose to:

- 1. Support developmental career education designed to provide students opportunities to enhance career awareness, exploration, preparation, and decision-making skills necessary for success in the workplace;
- 2. Provide secondary and postsecondary students with career and technical education programs and programs of study in Department-recognized Career Clusters in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:19-1.1(a)2.;
- 3. Support a comprehensive K-12 career education and counseling system; and
- 4. Support the workforce development system by helping to ensure quality postsecondary educational opportunities for adult students.

The Board provides a program of career and technical education with students guaranteed the right to apply and, if accepted, to attend a county vocational school district. The district shall provide a county vocational school district and its designated representative(s) with reasonable opportunity, during school hours, to present information about the county vocational school district's programs to all students, grades Kindergarten through twelve in the schools of the district in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:19-2.3(d). The Board of Education may not in any manner inhibit student access to such information.

In addition, the district has established local career and technical programs and programs of study approved pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:19-3.1 as part of a separate career and technical high school or as part of a comprehensive high school curriculum in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:19-2.1(e). These programs shall be approved by the Commissioner of Education.

Admission to the district's career and technical education programs will be open to regularly enrolled students in grades 8 through 12 on the basis of their potential for achieving the occupational or other objective of such instruction.

All students participating in career and technical education programs within this district or in shared-time career and technical programs are considered to be regularly enrolled in

the schools of this district and are subject to the policies and rules of this Board. The district shall establish admission requirements that include equity and access for all populations, including special populations and special education students. No student shall be denied admission or participation in any career and technical education programs due to race, color, creed, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender, socioeconomic status, or disability.

Students may be permitted to enroll in programs of vocational instruction offered by a county vocational school district outside the county only as required in the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:19-2.3(a)2.

The district will comply with the general program requirements for career and technical education as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:19-3.1. Students participating in part-time school and part-time employment career and technical programs will not be exploited, illegally employed, or employed under conditions that fail to safeguard the student's health and interest. These students shall receive wages commensurate with wages paid to other employees for similar work and shall be protected by provisions of the Worker's Compensation Act and any other acts of the State pertaining to such training and employment. The school district will comply with all safety and health standards contained in N.J.A.C. 6A:19-6.1 for career and technical education programs, programs of study, and structured learning experiences.

Career and technical education programs offered by the school district shall comply with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:54 and N.J.AC. 6A:19.

The Superintendent shall seek and utilize all available Federal, State, and private sources of revenue for the financial support of career and technical education programs in the district.

3216 DRESS AND GROOMING

The Board of Education believes the appearance and dress of teaching staff members is an important component of the educational program of this school district. The attitude of teaching staff members about their professional responsibilities and the importance of education in the lives of their students are reflected in their dress and appearance. Accordingly, in order to create an atmosphere of respect for teaching staff members and an environment conducive to discipline and learning, the Board establishes the following rules for the dress of teaching staff members in the performance of their professional duties:

- 1. Acceptable attire for teaching staff members shall include, but not be limited to, dresses, skirts, blouses, suits, sweaters, pants, and dress shirts with or without a tie;
- 2. Inappropriate attire within the regular school day includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - a. Jeans/leggings (unless approved by the Principal or designee for a special activity or event);
 - b. T-shirts;
 - c. Strapless shirts and dresses;
 - d. Sweatshirts, shorts, sweatpants, workout attire unless approved by the Principal or designee;
 - e. Beachwear;
 - f. Hats and/or head coverings unless approved by the Principal or designee for medical or religious reasons.
 - g. Open toe sandals;
 - h. Revealing clothing;
 - i. Tight-fitting clothing;
 - i. Lace up sneakers;
 - k. Shoes without straps attached firmly to the heel.

- The clothing and appearance of all teaching staff members shall be clean and 3.
- No clothing may be worn that constitutes a danger to health or safety to the 4. wearer or to others, and no clothing may be worn that interferes with the instructional program;
- A teaching staff member may request a waiver of this dress code for the 5. performance of particular duties. Such waivers may be granted by the Principal or designee.
- The Building Principal or the teaching staff member's supervisor, as appropriate, 6. shall determine whether a violation of this dress code has occurred and shall discuss the violation with the teaching staff member concerned. Where a single violation so warrants or violations recur, the Principal or supervisor may enter a reprimand in the teaching staff member's file and may recommend other appropriate disciplinary measures.

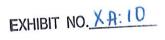

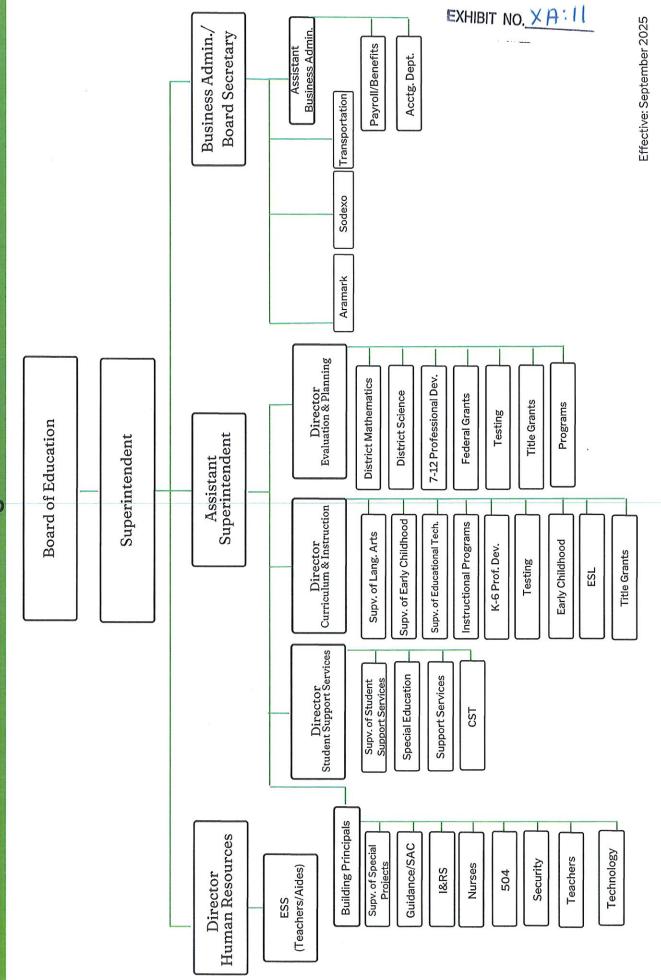
