A Visit From The High School - School One welcomed members of the Winslow High School Spanish Honor Society, who visited classrooms to present a lesson and engage students in interactive games.

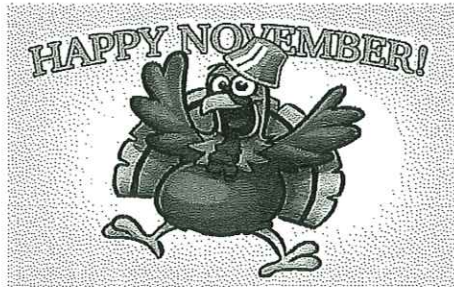

# A Day at Winslow High School

## Nurse's Corner



The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness. Most experts believe that flu viruses spread by droplets expelled when people with flu cough, sneeze, or talk. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby. Less often, a person might also get flu by touching a surface or object that has the flu virus on it and then touching their own mouths, eyes, or noses. Most healthy adults may be able to infect others beginning 1 day before symptoms develop and up to 5 to 7 days after becoming sick. Some people, especially young children, and people with weakened immune systems, might be able to infect others for an even longer time. The best way to prevent the flu is by getting a flu vaccine each year. People who have the flu often feel some or all these signs and symptoms:

- \* Fever\* or feeling feverish/chills
- \* Cough
- \* Sore throat
- \* Runny or stuffy nose
- \* Muscle or body aches
- \* Headaches
- \* Fatigue (very tired)
